

Program Delivery Flow Within an SA Program Model

(When the program is fully implemented)

NOTE: The SA Program Model is provided to local leaders who are ready and willing to implement it in their community. The SA Foundation trains & mentors these leaders and these programs are set up to be autonomous.

INITIAL DESIRE

Referrals come from street-level organizations, the police, social workers, probation officers, jails, and from word on the street.

FRONT-LINE HOUSING

New participants are placed in one of the front-line homes - either the nursery house, if they have children or are pregnant, the drug & alcohol house if they are dealing with addictions, or the third house if they are further along in their recovery (i.e. past the first 3 months) and/or foreign participants rescued from being trafficked into Canada.

A unique aspect of SA front-line housing is that it is run by voluntary live-in servants as it is a vocational position, rather than by paid staff.



TREATMENT CENTRE

When participants are struggling with addiction(s), they are referred to outside treatment centres for their initial recovery phase. Unique to the SA program is that while they are attending treatment, their bedroom is held for them so that when they complete the treatment phase, they can rejoin the SA program and continue their recovery process.



ASK LEARNING CENTRE - PHASE I PROGRAMMING

Once secure in their front-line house, participants join the ASK Learning Centre right away where they will be equipped with life skills, recovery skills and job preparedness training.

This program phase lasts anywhere from nine months to one year, depending on the level of achievement. Every 5th week celebration ceremonies are held to share in the success of participants, host graduations and celebrate birthdays.

While participants are in this phase of their programming, they remain in the front-line housing.



INDEPENDENCE

Although it may take up to several years to reach complete independence, the wait is worth it! Participants enter mainstream society with their heads held high, grounded in recovery and ready to meet life on life's terms!

It is not uncommon at this level for participants to desire to 'give back' and that can take the form of volunteering or working within the SA program through the Servant Leadership Program. The vision is that one day the SA program will be run by graduates that have moved from the Followcare level and become Honourary Servants.



SECOND STAGE & INDEPENDENT HOUSING

Once participants are ready to graduate from Phase I programming, they may still need additional support in their living environment. In such cases, they would be eligible to apply for a room in the Second Stage House where they will live more independently, but still receive onsite support as needed.

The duration for Second Stage Housing is 1 year to 18 months.

If a participant does not need the additional housing support, she may move into her own independent housing arrangement and may participate in Phase II programming through the ASK Reconnect Program.



ASK RECONNECT PROGRAM - PHASE II PROGRAMMING

After graduating from the ASK Learning Centre, participants may apply for Phase II programming through the ASK Reconnect Program. In this level, the focus of programming switches to job or school re-entry preparation. Participants graduated to this level will be eligible to receive a training grant for a position in the organization. The Employability Skills Development Program offered through this level is geared toward ensuring successful integration back into society at large.

Participants are in this phase of their programming for up to 1 year.



5 SERVICES THAT MAKE THE SA FRANCHISE MODEL UNIQUE

1. It is designed to meet the *specific recovery needs* of sexually exploited/trafficked youth and women.
2. It is designed to offer *long-term* services to this population (upwards of 7 years).
3. It provides *space for children* to come into the program with their mothers.
4. It offers an 'Advanced' program for *trafficked, terminally ill and learning disabled youth and women*, with program delivery tailored to meet their recovery needs.
5. It provides a home-like environment where live-in volunteers *share their lives* with participants of the program.
