



2020 ANNUAL REPORT: FROM THE PRESIDENT



Thank you for taking the time to come and read SA Foundation's 2020 Annual Report. As we look back over the past year through the lens of gratitude, this same lens gives us a hopeful and confident perspective on the future as well, even in this troubling time of a global pandemic.

As you will be able to read later in this report, we at the SA Foundation have the firm confidence in God that "as we model gratitude and share its fruit, it can also change the atmosphere for others, bringing peace where there may have been fear, joy where there may have been grief, calm instead of anxiety, and stability instead of shakiness." Maintaining a healthy perspective is so important at any time, and certainly during a pandemic.

Stepping back to view the global impact of Servants Anonymous over the past 3 decades offers such a perspective. SA has had the privilege of planting, developing and mentoring 12 organizations globally, 4 in Canada, 3 in the USA, 2 in Germany, 1 in Nepal, 1 in Greece and 1 in Budapest. Our statistics indicate that as of today, since the inception of SA over 30 years ago, around 6,000 women and 2,000 children have received services to escape sexual exploitation and trafficking.

As we position ourselves to adapt to the changing times in which we are living, we are expediting our efforts to develop and deliver online resources. This will help us achieve our goal of offering and replicating the SA Program Model more widely, efficiently and effectively.

We thank our Lord for daily shepherding us through these challenging times. We thank you for supporting us, praying for us and sticking with us, so that we are able to continue offering freedom, healing and hope to the many more women and children who still need to be set free.

REPLICATE—transformed, hope-filled lives that are replicated in the lives of their children, as well as the planting of new programs globally

Thank you, Champions for Freedom, for making it possible for us to continue offering the SA Program Model. Thank you, God, for surrounding us with such champions!





Our teams and participants are discovering on a daily basis the transforming power of gratitude in their lives and programs. Individually and within our teams, we have seen the difference this God-given and God-focussed gratitude makes in our perspective, in our attitudes, in our relationships, particularly when we practise gratitude as a regular rhythm—like breathing and eating.

Here is a testimony of such gratitude from one of our program participants.

"Thank you so much for the abundant love and care. Because of your unwavering support, I was able to reach where I am now. I'm the most thankful to God, for He brought me under the care of such wonderful guardians and has been guiding me through all kinds of challenges in my life-transforming journey.

Today, I receive the parental love and affection that I never got to experience as a child. Still, I have shortcomings and I'm only learning to make wise decisions in life. I'm grateful to have wonderful people around me to help me in this process, supporting me as I realize and learn from my mistakes. I'm also aware that so many people out there are praying for me and my sisters staying at the Recovery Home. I'm immensely thankful to all of you who have been praying for us, for your compassionate hearts that reach out to us. It means the world to us as we walk step by step to overcome every challenge that comes our way.

Slowly, the fear, guilt and shame associated with my past have faded away. I am healed, completely. The scars the trauma has left in my heart are only the reminder that I have stood victorious over it all. I'm very happy now because I've officially started working in the program for women like me who have experienced abuse and exploitation. I cannot possibly express how grateful I am for this opportunity Gentle Heart Foundation has provided for me. It's a great achievement for me that now, others look up to me for support and inspiration. Of course, it comes with a great set of responsibility so I'm constantly learning and trying to grow as a good person.

I also have a good relationship with my mother now. She says she is happy for me and relieved that I have a better life, better future. We are in constant touch and I'm glad that my daughter can witness a healthy relationship between me and my mother. When I reminisce about my past and then look at my present, it fills me with wonder. Sometimes, it seems so unlikely that I'm the same person who used to work overnight at bars, was toyed around by others, who used to remain intoxicated for days on end, unaware about my own value and the worth I can attain in life."—N in Nepal
